## LESLIE'S HEALTHY EATING CORNER

### BREAKFAST - Egg Muffins - serves 12

10 large eggs  
1 cup white (or orange) cheddar cheese  
1/4 tsp salt  
1 tbsp fresh minced chives

1/3 cup milk  
6 oz. cooked bacon  
1/4 tsp pepper

Preheat oven to 375 degrees. In a large glass mixing bowl, combine eggs and milk whisk well. Stir in 3/4 cups cheese, cooked bacon, salt and pepper. Divide mixture evenly among 12 greased muffin cups. Sprinkle with remaining 1/4 cup cheese and fresh chives over muffin cups. Bake at 375 degrees for 20 minutes or until centers are set and muffins are beginning to brown. Don't worry, cooked egg muffins can be frozen, taken out to thaw and zapped in the microwave.



### LUNCH - Cabbage and Cranberry Slaw -

serves 5

1/2 cup halved cranberries  
1 orange peeled and thinly sliced  
2 cups shredded cabbage  
1/3 cup fat-free mayonnaise or to taste

1/3 cup granulated sugar  
1/2 red onion, thinly sliced  
1 large apple peeled, cored and chopped

In a small bowl, toss together the cranberries and sugar. cover and refrigerate. In a large bowl, toss together the oranges, onion, cabbage, apple and mayonnaise until evenly coated. When ready to serve add cranberry mixture and toss again.

### SUPPER - Baked Honey, Mustard Chicken - serves 6

6 skinless, boneless chicken breast, halved  
1/2 cup honey  
1 tsp dried basil  
1/2 tsp dried parsley

salt and pepper to taste  
1/2 cup prepared mustard  
1 tsp paprika

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Sprinkle chicken breasts with salt and pepper to taste, and place in a lightly greased 9x13 inch baking dish. In a small bowl, combine the honey, mustard, basil, paprika and parsley. Mix well. Pour 1/2 of this mixture over the chicken, and brush to cover. Bake in the preheated oven for 30 minutes. Turn chicken pieces over and brush with the remaining 1/2 of the honey mustard mixture. Bake for an additional 10 to 15 minutes, or until the chicken is no longer pink and juices run clear. Let cool 10 minutes before serving.
