LESLIE'S HEALTHY EATING CORNER

Breakfast: BANANA CHOCOLATE-CHIP MINI MUFFINS - Serves 36

1 cup light artificially sweetened vanilla yogurt	1-1/4 cups all-purpose flour
1/2 cup skim milk or 1% milk	1/2 cup unpacked brown sugar
1/2 cup uncooked quick oats	2 tsp baking powder
1/2 tsp vanilla extract	1/2 tsp baking soda
1 large egg beaten	1/2 tsp table salt (optional)
1 large banana mashed	1/2 cup mini dark chocolate chips divided

* Preheat oven to 375 degrees. Coat 36 mini muffin holes with cooking spray.

* In a large mixing bowl, combine yogurt, milk, oats, vanilla extract, and egg; set aside set aside 5 minutes for oats to soften and then stir in banana.

* In a separate bowl, stir together flour, brown sugar, baking powder, baking soda, and salt. Stir flour mixture into yogurt mixture to moisten ingredients (do not beat - the batter will be very thick). Reserve 1 tbsp. chips; stir in remaining chips

* Spoon batter by heaping tablespoons into prepared muffin holes; sprinkle each with a few reserved chocolate chips. bake until golden brown and a tester inserted in centre of a muffin comes out clean, 15 to 18 minutes

* Have one or two muffins with fresh fruit or yogurt makes a healthy breakfast.

Lunch: NAPA SALAD

1 head of Napa Cabbage, wash and cut up. Slice 4 to 6 green onions. Mix and Refrigerate for several hours

Combine 1 cup sliced almonds, 1/3 cup sesame seeds, 2 packages Chinese noodles (broken up) and 1/3 cup melted butter. Bake at 350 degrees on cookie sheet for 10 minutes, stir a few times. Let cool. Keep in container to use as needed.

Dressing:	2/3 cup olive oil	1/3 cup vinegar
	2/3 cup white sugar or sweetener	3 tbsp. soya sauce

Heat to dissolve dressing then let cool, then refrigerate. Add Nut Mixture and Dressing just before serving

NOTE: Use only as much cabbage, dressing and nut mixture as needed. Store the three mixtures in separate containers until you want to use them.

Dinner: SAUCY CHICKEN PARMESAN SKILLET - Serves 4

1 tbsp. oil
4 skinless, boneless chicken breasts
1/2 pound fresh mushrooms chopped
1 onion, chopped
1 can, Italian style diced tomatoes, un-drained
1/2 cup Creamy Mozza Shredded Cheese with a Touch of Philadelphia
1/4 cup 100% Parmesan Aged Grated Cheese

* Heat oil in a large skillet on medium heat. Add chicken, mushrooms and onions; cook 8 to 10 minutes or until chicken is done, turning chicken and stirring vegetables after 5 minutes.

* Remove chicken from skillet, reserving vegetables in skillet; cover chicken to keep warm.

* Add tomatoes to skillet; stir. cook 5 minutes or until heated through, stirring occasionally. Top with chicken.

* Combine cheeses; sprinkle over chicken. Cover, cook 2 minutes or until shredded cheese is melted.

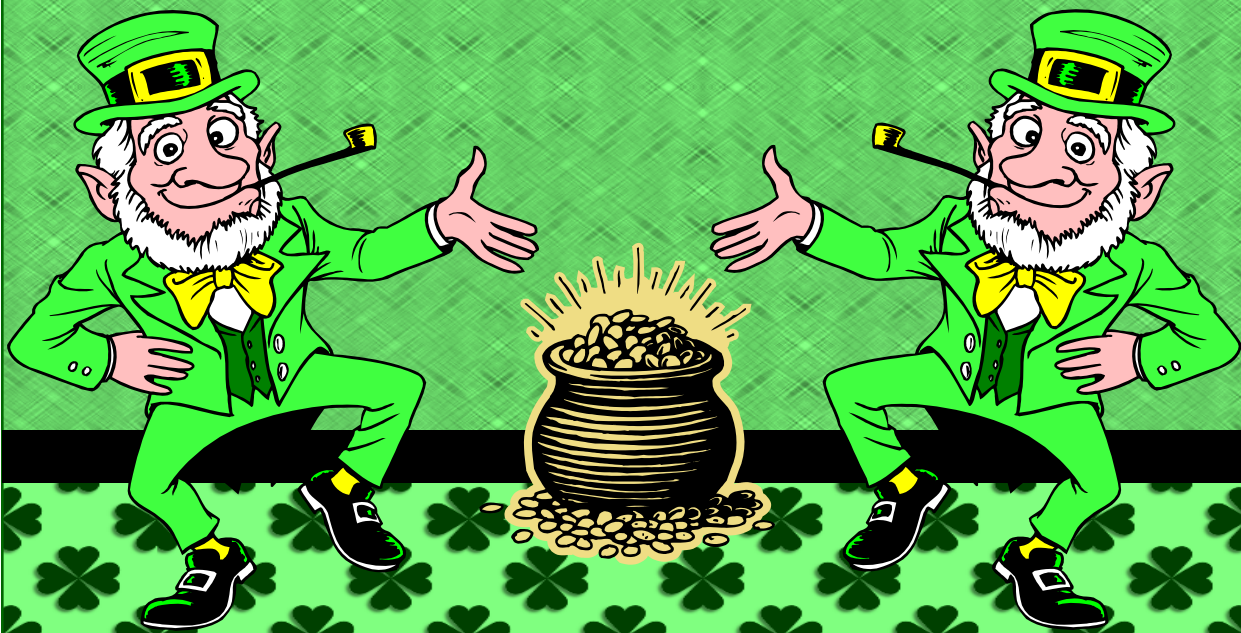

VETERANS NEWS

OTTAWA, ON, 9 February 2015 – Almost a thousand homeless and near homeless Veterans have been helped by The Royal Canadian Legion through its "Leave the Streets Behind" program. "The Royal Canadian Legion has the resources to help Veterans directly and immediately," says Dominion President of The Royal Canadian Legion, Tom Eagles. In 2014 alone, the Legion distributed approximately \$14.5 Million from our Poppy Funds to Veterans in need – including homeless and near homeless Veterans. "The plight of homeless and near homeless Veterans is of growing concern which is why we launched our national homeless Veterans program called 'Leave the Streets Behind' in 2012," adds Eagles. "This program provides immediate financial help and support when and where needed. It also connects the Veteran with the appropriate social and community services to establish a long-term solution to meet their needs," says Eagles. "Helping our homeless and near homeless Veterans is one more reason why joining the Legion is one of the best ways to help Veterans who, in many cases, have sacrificed so much for this nation and now find themselves asking for a hand-up and not a hand-out," says Eagles. Assistance can be provided for a variety of reasons including medical needs, medical equipment, emergency transport and emergency financial assistance such as food, heating costs and emergency shelter or assistance. Assistance cannot be provided over an extended period of time but may be offered more than once to an individual.

OTTAWA, February 11th, 2015 – In August 2012, Environics Research Group conducted an omnibus survey about the Legion and the results of those polled who are aware or have heard about The Royal Canadian Legion is very telling. Some 95% of those surveyed believed it was very or somewhat important that the Legion "assist Canadian Veterans in obtaining pensions and other services." Similarly, some 93% of those surveyed felt it was very or somewhat important that the Legion "promote and continue the tradition of Remembrance Day in Canada." Another majority of Canadians surveyed who were aware of The Legion said, when asked: "Do you have a very favourable, somewhat favourable, somewhat unfavourable or very unfavourable opinion or impression of The Royal Canadian Legion?" that they had either a very or somewhat favorable impression of the Legion (e.g. 81%)

When asked, "If the Royal Canadian Legion will or will not continue to have a function or role in Canadian society?" Again an overwhelming majority (e.g. 72%) of those polled said the Legion will have a future. Finally, when asked if there was any: "negative thing that comes to mind about The Royal Canadian Legion" of those aware of the Legion almost 60% said "no." "These poll results make it clear that the Legion has, over the course of its 90 years, played an important role for our Veterans and our communities. It is a tradition that we gladly accept and will continue with pride," says Dominion President of The Royal Canadian Legion, Tom Eagles

OTTAWA - A wounded soldier who lost both legs in Afghanistan will have to verify his condition and the kind of support needed, including his wheelchair, to Veterans Affairs every three years, rather than annually under a policy change. The revision was quietly unveiled in the House of Commons on Friday by Pierre Lemieux, parliamentary secretary to the veterans minister. In addition, Lemieux told opposition parties that veterans who are required to complete these renewals under the veterans independence program will have six months to hand in the paperwork, considerably longer than under the current system. Paul Franklin, who was a master corporal when he lost his legs in a 2006 roadside bombing in Kandahar, has long complained about the veterans system and its annual review. He says he was well looked after at National Defence, but has faced a bureaucratic nightmare since retiring almost six years ago and coming under the veterans department. His plight caused a political sensation and even drew the attention of comedian Rick Mercer, who devoted a rant to the subject. A spokesman for Veterans Affairs Minister Erin O'Toole stressed the process is not meant to reconfirm the injury, but to track changes in the condition of ex-soldiers. "Veterans who have been granted entitlement for a disability benefit from (Veterans Affairs Canada) for any service-related injury or condition are not asked to prove their disability again once they have been granted entitlement," said Marton Magnan in an email statement. "Veterans who face serious injuries face potentially a fluctuating health condition related to the original injury. Veterans Affairs has a responsibility to proactively update the government to ensure they have the necessary support and treatment for their current condition." Magnan also said the government "places the highest priority on making sure Veterans and their families have the support and services they need, when they need it."
