LESLIE'S HEALTHY EATING CORNER

BREAKFAST - Swedish Omelette - serves 1

2 tsp. butter 1/2 pound fresh mushrooms
2 tbsp. sour cream sprinkling of dill
salt and pepper 2 eggs
2 tsp. water

Melt 1 tsp butter in pan. Add mushrooms and stir until lightly saute. Drain, pat dry and mix with sour cream, dill, salt and pepper. Set aside. Wipe pan, melt remaining butter. Beat together eggs and water. Pour into pan and cook until set. Fill the center with about 1/3 of the sauce mixture., fold two side toward the center and slide onto serving dish. Top with remaining sauce.

LUNCH - Cobb Coleslaw Salad with maple Dressing - serves 4

5 cups shredded savoy cabbage 1 cup shredded red cabbage
1 medium carrot coarsely grated 1 1/2 cups diced cooked chicken
1 cup diced cucumbers 2 hard boiled eggs quartered
1 tomato cut into thin wedges 1 cup sliced mushrooms
1/2 cup crumbled blue cheese 1/4 cup chopped cooked bacon

Dressing:

1/2 cup vegetable oil 1/2 cup Maple Syrup
1/4 cup cider vinegar 2 tsp Dijon mustard
salt and pepper to taste

Dressing: In a small bowl whisk together oil, maple syrup, vinegar, mustard and salt to pepper to taste. In a large bowl, toss together savoy and red cabbage, carrot, and 1/4 cup of the dressing. Arrange cabbage mixture on large platter. Top with chicken, cucumber, eggs, tomato and mushrooms. Sprinkle with cheese and bacon Refrigerate or serve immediately drizzled with remaining dressing.

SUPPER - Pork Chops with Apples and Raisins - serves 3-6


6 Pork Chops 1/2 cup frozen apple juice concentrate thawed
1/4 cup water 1 tsp. beef bouillon mix
1/2 cup finely chopped onion 1 clove garlic minced
2 large apples cored 1/2 tsp thyme
1/4 cup raisins 1 1/3 cup milk
3 tbsp flour

Brown chops on both sides in butter. Combine juice, water, bouillon mix; pour over chops. Sprinkle with onion, garlic, thyme. Cut apples, arrange on meat. Sprinkle raisins. Bring to a boil, reduce heat, cover, simmer for 25 minutes. Remove all and keep heated. Combine milk and flour. Stir into pan juices. cook and stir until boiled and thickens. Add salt and pepper. Pour sauce over chops and apples.
